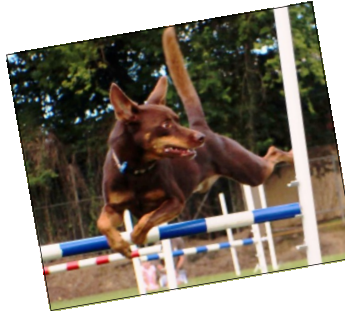
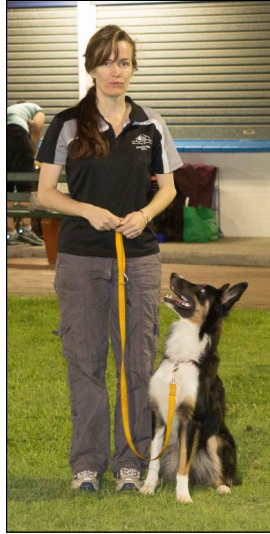

Pet Manners Course

Entry Level 5 week course. Handlers are given the basic training tools for developing a great working relationship with their canine partner and teach their dog to become a well mannered member of the family (incl. Sign-on Info Session for handlers).

- How to use Positive reinforcement methods
- Clear communication with your dog

Puppy Pre-school

9 week program specifically developed for young dogs from 12 weeks to 5 months.

Offers important opportunities to socialize.

Handlers will learn the basic principles of positive reinforcement training and many useful hints and tips for training your puppy to become a pleasant well adjusted member of your family.

This course improves the puppy's confidence and develops important canine social interaction skills. 4 weeks indoors, then 4 weeks outdoors to learn basic obedience skills.

Includes Sign-on and Info session for handlers.

Obedience level 1 - 3:

Entry level obedience training leading on from Puppy Pre-School and Pet Manners Course. Dogs and handlers will refine their technique in heeling, building on their stays and recalls.

At level 3, dogs are required to heel, sit, stand, drop, and stay reliably. At this level dogs will have to perform a recall off lead. Achieving this level depends on the skill level of you and your dog, and the time you have invested in training your dog.

The Cairns City Council recognizes the standard and quality of training provided by the CCKC and dogs with level 3 certificates receive a 50% reduction off the annual council registration fees.



Obedience Advanced

Dog and handler teams that have caught the "obedience bug" advance their training techniques and fine tune their handling skills with the aim to enter obedience trials. Individual sessions with an experienced instructor working on specific problems and improving team work with your dog.

Entry level trials CCD (Community Companion Dog) consists of heel work on lead, sit, stand, down commands, Stand for Examination, a recall off lead and 1 min sit stay and 2 min down stays.



Agility Beginners Course

This extremely exciting dog sport brings team work with your canine partner to new levels. Beginners course starts in September. Embark on a very rewarding path to competition agility and jumping. You learn new skills: working your dog on both sides of your body, directional clues, using equipment safely by having contact criteria, improve physical capabilities and build confidence with fun games. Training your dog for agility takes commitment and daily homework is essential. Dogs must be able to work reliably off lead and need to be at least 12 months old.

Beware – this is serious FUN and highly addictive!



Agility Advanced training

Training for competition. Thursday night Sessions, working on sequences, weaves, contact training, problem solving. (Participation in this class is subject to skill level test of dog and handler team).

Weekly weekend session with full courses.

- In these sessions all dogs must be crated.
- All handlers are expected to help set up and put away equipment.



Breed Advice:

Looking for a dog to be part of your family and/or for competition purposes? We can assist with advice on suitability of different breeds to help you make an informed decision on the right canine partner.

Please take care to choose a responsible breeder who takes care in choosing their breeding stock and performs important hereditary disease testing. These results should be available to you prior to purchase. All puppies should have a pedigree.



Rescue dogs: We support handlers who give a home to a rescue dog. You should consider what breeds the dog is bred from to recognize how breed traits will affect your relationship. If you are not sure what would be the right dog for you, we can help with temperament testing prospective dogs for you.



Show Training

Ring training for handlers with pedigree dogs who are interested in showing their dogs. Learn the ropes every Monday night.
